What will your project involve?		
<p>We are concerned about the misunderstanding between young and older people in Devizes. We would like to do an art project to bring together groups of young and older people in shared activities to build relationships and break down barriers. We would like to run intergenerational arts workshops in the Easter holidays. There will be a workshop every afternoon from 2-4pm during the first week. We can have a maximum of 100 people at each session, 50 young and 50 older people. We will use recycled materials from Wiltshire Scrapstore in the art work. There will be a large range of possible activities to get involved in from multi media, to fashion design, sculpture, painting and designing. We will work with the gallery who have agreed to help us organise and lead the workshops. We will work with AgeUK to promote the workshops to older people's groups in the area. We will promote the workshops to young people with posters in school, at assembly and on Facebook.</p>
