

Melksham Town Centre Improvements

Background Information

The proposed scheme layout for the town centre improvements has been prepared in line with the scheme objectives and the requirements of local stakeholders, local residents and the steering group. The whole scheme, which sees improvements throughout Melksham Town Centre, from King Street all the way through to Lowbourne, can be viewed at an exhibition currently on display at the Town Hall. Phase four of the scheme concentrates on footway improvements in Church Street and will also see a new signalised junction at High Street / Church Street.

Phase Four - Construction Programme

A detailed breakdown highlighting the construction stages of the Phase Four construction programme is shown in the plan on the right. Works will commence at the access road to Church Street car park with traffic managed locally by temporary traffic signals. The existing High Street / Church Street signals will operate as normal. As the works move towards the junction the temporary signals will be removed and the existing signals amended to manage traffic. Due to the narrow road width at the High Street / Church Street junction and the desire to complete works in the shortest possible time, there will be some road closures required. These will affect through traffic for a total of up to 7 weeks. Access will be maintained to Church Street car park from either the north or south at all times and for deliveries as required during this period. Advanced signing will indicate when road closures are to be implemented.
