1A. **Catholic children in care.** A baptismal certificate will normally be required.

1. **Catholic children living in the Catholic Parish of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Devizes.** A map of this area is available at the school. A baptismal certificate will be required. Within this category, priority for admission will be given in the following order to:-

- Baptised worshipping Catholics. Information will be requested about frequency of Mass attendance and confirmation of this will be required from the Parish Priest.
- Siblings of children at the school.
- Other Catholic children living in the Catholic Parish of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Devizes.

2. **Catholic children from outside the Catholic Parish of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Devizes for whom St Joseph's is the nearest Catholic Primary School.** A baptismal certificate will be required. Within this category, priority for admission will be given in the following order to:

- Baptised worshipping Catholics. Information will be requested about frequency of Mass attendance and confirmation of this will be required from the Parish Priest.
- Siblings of children at the school.
- Other Catholic children from outside the Parish for whom St Joseph's is the nearest Catholic primary school.

3. **Other children in care**

4. **Other children who would have siblings attending St Joseph's at the time of their admission.** Within this category, priority for admission will be given in the following order to:

- Children of a baptised Catholic parent. Evidence, such as the parent's baptismal certificate, will be required to support an application in this category.
- Children from committed Christian families who express a wish for their children to receive a Christian education. Applications must be supported in writing by the appropriate Minister of Religion to establish practice and commitment
- Other children who would have siblings attending St Joseph's at the time of their admission.

**5. Children of a Catholic parent.** Evidence, such as the parent's baptismal certificate, will be required to support an application in this category. Priority within this category will be given to

a. Children of committed Christian families who express a wish for their children to receive a Christian education. Applications must be supported in writing by the appropriate Minister of Religion to establish practice and commitment.

b. Other children of a Catholic parent.

**6. Children of committed Christian families who express a wish for their children to receive a Christian education.** Applications must be supported in writing by the appropriate Minister of Religion to establish practice and commitment.

**7. Other children.** Applications will be considered as Category 7 unless appropriate evidence has been provided to allow consideration in a higher category.

**Siblings of multiple births.** Twins or other children of multiple births will be considered ahead of other children in each category. Where a choice has to be made either between different families or between multiple birth siblings of the same family then the Tie Break will apply (Random allocation, as detailed below)

**Tie break** Where decisions between children within a category or sub-category have to be made the decision will be made by random allocation. If a tie break situation arose between children from multiple births (twins, triplets etc) the Governors would where possible admit these siblings even if the Published Admissions Number were exceeded. If this were not possible then the decision would be made by random allocation. This will not be possible if it leads to an infant class size in excess of 30 pupils. Random allocation decisions will be made by persons independent of the school (e.g. Local Authority Admissions Team)

### **3 Living within the school's designated area:**

5 **Any other children** not covered in the previous criteria.

Please note that children of parents in any occupation or profession are NOT given priority (except military families as stipulated in the Admissions Code of Practice).

If there are more applications, which satisfy a criterion (3, 4, or 5 as applicable) then **children who live permanently at the shortest distance from the school measured**

by a straight line will act as a 'tie-breaker'. This means that if there is still over subscription distances will be measured according to Ordnance Survey Eastings and Northings for the child's home address and the school. Those living close to the school will be given priority. If two or more children with the same priority for admission live an indistinguishable distance from the school, but cannot be admitted, then the available places will be decided by the casting of lots.
