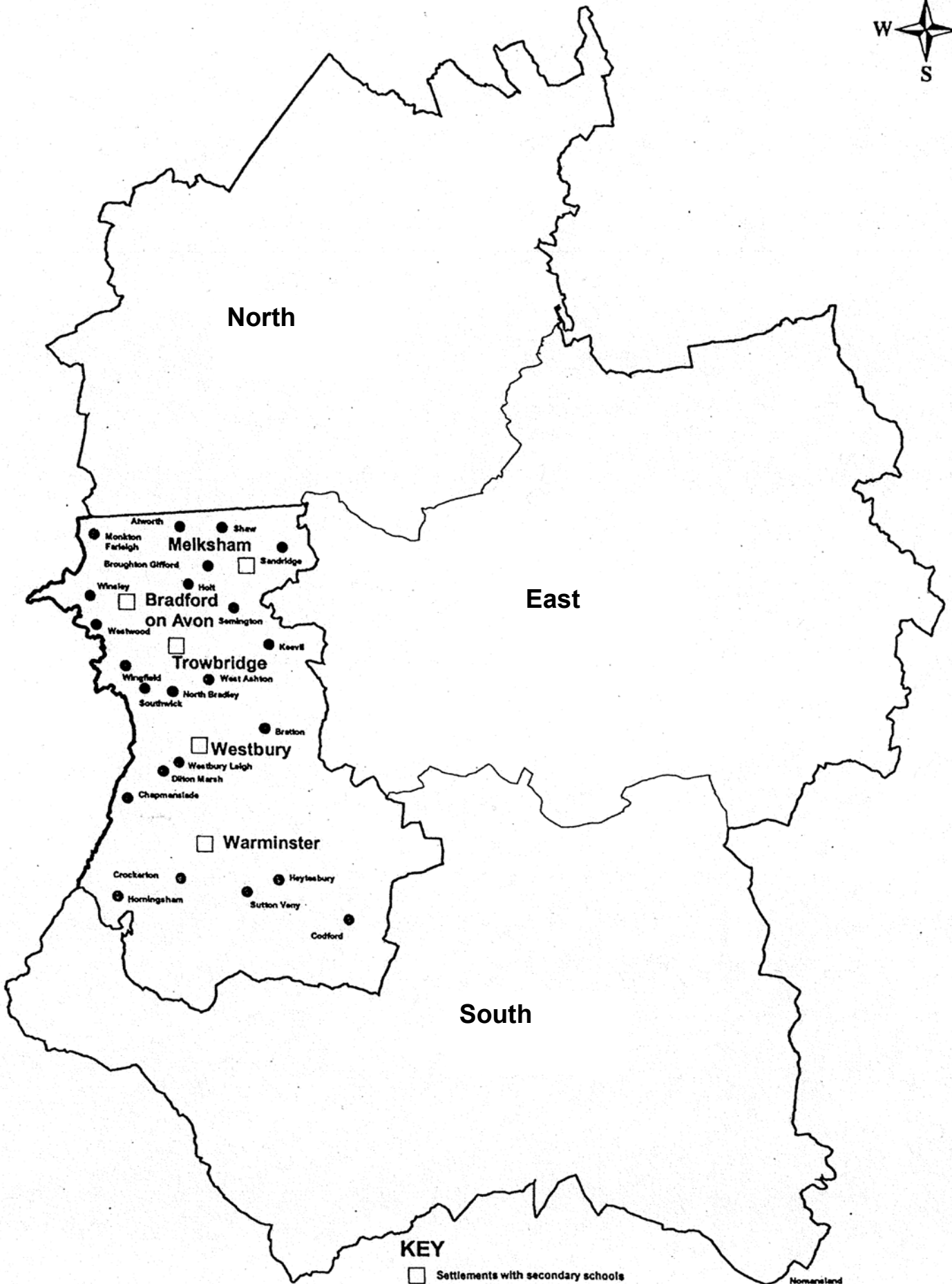

**Summary of admission criteria**

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied, in the order set out below, to determine which child to admit. In the event of selection being required under criteria 1, 2, 3, or 4 then the proximity of the child's home will be the deciding factor. Proximity will be determined using distances provided by the LA and measured using ordnance survey eastings and northings unique for each postal address. Those living nearer will be given the higher priority. Waiting lists for all year groups will be maintained for a period of two terms.

**1. Looked after children.**

**2. Sibling** -where the child has a sibling currently attending the school in Years R – 5 inclusive – sibling being defined as a brother or sister (including step, half and foster siblings) who live at the same address.

**3. Medical** - where there are medical grounds, supported by a doctor's certificate, for admitting the child.

### Summary of admission criteria

#### 1. Children in Care (Looked After Children)

Children within Local Authority care, e.g. children in residential homes or in foster care. (Section 22 of the Children's Act 1989) and who the Local Authority has confirmed will still be looked after at the time of admission to the school.

#### 2. Vulnerable Children

- a. Children from families registered with the National Asylum Support Service. Children with a medical condition where written evidence is available from a senior clinical medical officer and the child's general practitioner or specialist, showing that it would be detrimental to the child's health not to admit him/her to the school.
- b. Children with particular educational needs where written evidence is available from Central SEN Services to show that it would be detrimental to the child not to be admitted to the school.

#### 3. Children living within the designated area of the school

The area is defined and published annually in the form of a list of streets. Parts of the designated area are shared with other local schools and these are identified on the list. Depending on demand, parents/guardians should note that living within this area shall not be considered to be a guarantee of acceptance.

#### 4. Siblings living within the designated area of the school

Where the child has a brother or sister (including step, half and foster siblings) currently attending this school, a child is considered under this criterion if:

- A sibling is on the roll of King's Park Primary School, as at the deadline date; and will continue to attend at the time of entry, and where the child lives at the same address as the sibling. Step, half and foster siblings are included in this category.

#### 5. Other children living within the designated area of the school

Children to whom none of the above apply.

This section applies to children living **outside** the school's designated area as defined above.

#### 6. Siblings children living outside the school's designated area

A child is considered in this category if an older sibling is attending the school at the deadline date and will continue to do so when the sibling is admitted, and where the child lives outside the designated area at the same address as the elder sibling. Step, half and foster siblings are considered in this category, as well as the children of couples who have registered a civil partnership.

In all other oversubscribed criteria the straight line distance from the front gate of the school to the front door of the child's home

address will be used as the determining factor. If two or more children with the same priority for admission live an indistinguishable distance from the school, but cannot be admitted, then the available places will be decided by the casting of lots.

Children within Local Authority care as defined in Section 22 of the Children's Act 1989 for example, children in residential homes or foster care.

## 2. Vulnerable children

- a. children of families with confirmed refugee status
- b. children with a medical condition where written evidence is available from a senior clinical medical officer and the child's general practitioner or specialist showing that it would be detrimental to the child's health not to admit him/her to the school. Details of this must accompany the initial application.
- c. children where one or both parents have a disability which would make travel to a different school difficult. Evidence from a registered health professional such as a doctor or social worker will be required. Details of this must accompany the initial application.

### Living within the school's designated area:

#### 3. Siblings
