Notes

- Swindon and Wiltshire LEA 2013 and Swindon and Wiltshire SEP 2015-2026 both used the same forecasts. The difference is that the LEA factored in that the forecasts were made before the recession, so applied a reduction to the figures on that basis. Essentially, their starting position was 30,000, but they reduced this. When the SEP quotes the figure of 30,000 from the LEA, it doesn't seem to mention that the LEA reduced this figure.

- Cambridge Econometrics and Oxford Economics forecasts were procured by HJA.
- The Swindon and Wiltshire SEP 2012-2026 just combines the two separate forecasts from the Wiltshire Core Strategy 2006-2026 and the Swindon Borough Local Plan 2006-2026.
- The Swindon Borough Local Plan adopted the higher growth figures from the Economic Strategy for Swindon 2012-2026. The base case figures from that report are included as a comparison.
- Growth trajectories are shown as straight line interpolation
