

Domestic Abuse: information and support

We believe that no one should live in fear of abuse from a spouse or partner, former spouse or partner, or from any other member of their household. We will, therefore, take the appropriate steps to assist anyone who is suffering from or threatened by domestic abuse.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse can go beyond actual physical violence. It can also involve:

- emotional abuse
- the destruction of property
- isolation from friends, family or other potential sources of support
- control over access to money, personal items, food, transportation and the telephone
- stalking

The definition used by Wiltshire Council is the same as the definition used by the government, which is: "Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are or have been intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality. This can encompass, but is not limited to, the following types of abuse:

- psychological
- physical
- sexual
- financial
- emotional

Controlling behaviour is: a range of acts designed to make a person subordinate and/or dependent by isolating them from sources of support, exploiting their resources and capacities for personal gain, depriving them of the means needed for independence, resistance and escape and regulating their everyday behaviour.

Coercive behaviour is: an act or a pattern of acts of assault, threats, humiliation and intimidation or other abuse that is used to harm, punish, or frighten their victim."

Why it is important that we take action

Anyone can be a victim of domestic abuse. Although domestic abuse is more commonly carried out by men against female partners, it can also be carried out by women against men, and it can also occur in same sex relationships and between family members.

Some facts

Estimates suggest that one in four women and one in six men will be a victim of domestic abuse in their lifetime

- One incident of domestic abuse is reported to the police every minute across England and Wales
- Abuse within the household was the fourth highest priority cause of homelessness in Wiltshire in 2009/10.

What you should do

We recognise that it can be difficult to talk about domestic abuse; however, it is important that you tell us what is happening. We will discuss the options that are available to you and provide you with information on support that can be provided by other organisations.

What we will do

We will provide information on advice and support available both within the council and externally and:

- Discuss the available options with you and take a victim-centred approach
- Offer an interview with an officer of the same sex
- Provide a confidential and sensitive service
- Establish if there are any special needs that should to be taken into account, for example the need for an interpreter or a sign language translator
- Conduct interviews in private and if necessary in a place of safety.
