Ecological surveys and assessments When required

Find out if your application needs to be supported by ecological information, by going to <u>Biodiversity and</u> <u>development - Wiltshire Council</u> and clicking on the guidance form "Does my application need to be supported by ecological Information?" Please note this is a guide only and may not pick up all ecological constraints relevant to your application.

What information is required?

This depends on the nature of your proposal and its geographical location within Wiltshire. This link <u>Biodiversity and development - Wiltshire Council</u> can help you decide what to include in ecology survey and assessment reports and what to submit if you need to demonstrate Biodiversity Net Gain and / or nutrient neutrality. From this link you can also access information about mitigation strategies and contribution rates where development affects protected sites.
