Scale 1:2500 or 1:1250

#### When required

All applications

#### What information is required?

- Up to date map with site edged clearly with a red line, including any required visibility splays and access to the site from the public highway
- The direction of north should be shown.
- The plan must cover a large enough area to enable the location to be easily found.
- A blue line should be drawn around any other land owned by the applicant

#### What information is required?

- The plan must show the proposed development in relation to the site boundaries and other existing buildings on the site.
- Written dimensions, including those to the boundary, should be shown.
- Any trees or public rights of way affected by the development should be shown, together with the proposed parking arrangements
- Any new boundary walls or fencing proposed as part of the development

A written statement which explains the design principles and concepts that have been applied to the development and that: Demonstrates the steps taken to appraise the context of the development and how the design of the development takes that into account; Demonstrates how the design principles and concepts take account of the special architectural or historic importance of the building: Demonstrates how the design principles and concepts take account of the particular physical features of the building that justify its designation as a listed building: Demonstrates how the design principles and concepts take account of the buildings setting: Explains the policy adopted as to access, and how development plan policies relating to access have been taken into account: States what consultation, if any, has been undertaken on issues relating to access and what account has been taken of the outcome of any such consultation; Explains how any specific issues which might affect access to the development have been addressed The written statement should include an assessment of the impact of the proposed works on the significance of the building and those areas affected by the works, including any steps that are to be taken to avoid or minimise any adverse impacts. It is rare that plans will be accepted at a smaller scale as it becomes difficult to illustrate architectural features. However in the case of very simple localised works, or large buildings where very simple localised works are proposed, plans on a smaller scale of 1:100 may be acceptable.
